Additional information

I have never had formal training in computer technology. I commenced my computer experience in 1978 (commodore 64) then used DOS machines until Windows 8. In 1985 I worked with an Apple 512 and that is where my passion started for Apple.

During the majority of my teaching I worked with both Apple and Windows based machines. Since retiring in 2011 my main focus has been on ISO devices (iPad and iPhone) and Apple computers.

Cycle through open windows: Press Alt + tab to cycle through all the open windows on your screen. Add the Shift key to cycle backwards, which means you can go back and forth between tabs without touching your mouse or trackpad. You don't need to click on each tab individually if you know this shortcut.

CTRL + Z: Will undo the previous action, in most cases. Woops! Didn't mean to delete that page, text, picture CTRL + Z will bring it back. It is Possible to press CTRL + Z a number of times to undo a number of previous actions on most computers.
